The RBVRRWCP and Larix International Pte Ltd collectively referred to as the "Parties",

RECOGNIZING their mutual interest in global scientific organization on a non-commercial basis, and also

RECOGNIZING the global nature of today's business, industrial and social problems, and the need to address them through mutual cooperation, Hereby agree to encourage research collaboration according to the terms and conditions set forth in the following articles.

### Article 1: Fields of Collaboration

### RBVRRWCP and LARIX INTERNATIONAL PTE LTD

may collaborate within any mutually agreeable field of research and education

### Article 2: Conducting Workshops and Conferences

### Article 3:

- 3.1 Both the parties are not involved in any financial obligations or agreements, but if needed, and agreed upon on the programs conducted together with a cause or that helps the growth of the students, faculty.
- 3.2 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required.

### Article 4: Validity of MoU

4.1This Agreement will be valid a period of 5 Years from the date of agreement being Signed, it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms.

### Article 5: Administration and General Provisions

- 5.1 This MOU shall have an initial duration of five years from the date of signature, unless either party gives a six-month notice of termination. This MOU may be extended further, in five-year increments, by mutual written agreement
- 5.2 Despite the statements and obligations expressed herein, this MOU is a nonbinding expression of the current intentions of the Parties, and neither Party will incur nor be bound to any legal obligations or expense hereunder to the other Party until and unless definitive agreements have been negotiated, approved by the necessary management levels of each Party and executed and delivered by authorized representatives of both Parties.
